What can you do?




You can ask why your guardian made this decision.




Your guardian will write to you. They will tell you

It may take 4 weeks to tell you.

It is the same as 28 days.

You agree with what they say. That is good.

You think they made the wrong decision.

You do **not** think this is a good decision.




You need to write to the Public Guardian.



What will the Office of the Public Guardian do?



We write to you.

It tells you we have your letter.

This may take 2 weeks.

This is the same as 14 days.



A different person reads your file.

This person was **not** at your meeting.

They think about your problem.


They decide what may be best for you.

They write a report. It is for the Public Guardian.


The report helps the Public Guardian know what to do.




We write to you. It is a new letter.








